

- 01 **What does ARCHES stand for?**
"A" = Application "R" = Relationships "C" = Connections "H" = History "E" = Exact Words "S" = Savior
- 02 **Are there instructions for how to use ARCHES Doorway to Discovery?**
Yes, they're included in the download. ARCHES Doorway to Discovery pages can be downloaded from the iNeedtheBible store. Or, if you prefer to use ARCHES Doorway to Discovery on the computer, rather than printing out the papers, you can sign up to receive email updates and download the ARCHES Interactive version FREE. Either download you choose will include instructions.
- 03 **What's the difference between the ARCHES Devotional Journal and ARCHES Doorway to Discovery?**
"ARCHES" is the overall name of the devotional journal. It consists of one core journal section called "ARCHES Doorway to Discovery" and six additional journal pages. The additional journal pages include: ARCHES Enter In, ARCHES Live It, ARCHES On Topic, ARCHES Treasure, ARCHES Storyboard, and ARCHES Free Write.
- 04 **What's the difference between ARCHES and the ARCHES e-journal?**
ARCHES and the ARCHES e-journal contain the same journal pages. The ARCHES e-journal is presented on the computer in an interactive PDF format for your convenience. Using the ARCHES e-journal eliminates the need to print out so many papers. Sketching is not available on the Storyboard and Treasure pages in the interactive version.
- 05 **Does the ARCHES e-journal contain all the journal pages?**
Yes. However, the ARCHES e-journal does not allow drawing/sketching on the Storyboard and Treasure journal pages.
- 06 **Do I have to use all the ARCHES journal pages to make ARCHES effective?**
No. You can simply use ARCHES Doorway to Discovery to dig deeper into God's Word. The additional journal pages are optional and hopefully added blessings for those of you who choose to use them.
- 07 **Can I use the ARCHES journal pages without using ARCHES Doorway to Discovery?**
Yes. However, ARCHES Doorway to Discovery is the core of the ARCHES Devotional Journal.
- 08 **Am I supposed to use ARCHES Doorway to Discovery every day?**
Some people will want to use it every day. Some people will want to use it once a week. Some people will use it whenever they read a passage they are interested in knowing more about. Some will use it with an ARCHES Devotional Guide.
- 09 **Am I supposed to use all the ARCHES journal pages every day?**
The ARCHES journal pages are designed to be used like an ongoing journal. You can use them as often as you like, and continue to add more pages to your binder as needed, or you can download an ARCHES Devotional Guide for use with the ARCHES Devotional Journal.
- 10 **Am I supposed to study one verse using ARCHES Doorway to Discovery and continue to study the same verse using the rest of the journal pages?**
Not necessarily. ARCHES is flexible. ARCHES journal pages can be used independent of each other. Check out the ARCHES Devotional Guides for more direction.
- 11 **How many verses should I study at a time when I use ARCHES Doorway to Discovery?**
It works best if you study one to four verses at a time. Because you also study the context surrounding the verse, as well as cross-references, you will likely discover quite a bit about the entire chapter where the verse is located.
- 12 **What is an ARCHES Devotional Guide?**
ARCHES Devotional Guides lead you through your devotion time with day by day instruction based on using the ARCHES Devotional Journal. There are topical guides or guides taking you through a book of the Bible. ARCHES Devotional Guides are available in the ineedthebible.com shop
- 13 **Do I have to read the Bible in chronological order to use ARCHES?**
No. ARCHES Doorway to Discovery, along with most of the journal pages, can be used any time you read the Bible, no matter what order you read it in. The ARCHES Storyboard journal page is included for those who choose to storyboard the Bible's big picture in chronological order, or in the order they read it.
- 14 **Do I have to read the Bible in chronological order to use Storyboard?**
No. ARCHES Storyboard works well for chronological Bible study, but it can also be used to storyboard individual books, or chapters, of the Bible. For example: You can read the book of Matthew and storyboard the events in the order you read them--chapter by chapter.
